<u>**Punctuation**</u> : Copy out each sentence neatly, in joined handwriting, and underline the adverbials. Some sentences have more than one adverbial!

\*\*An adverbial is a group of words which **acts as an adverb** and **is used to modify a verb** or (less commonly) **an adjective**. Adverbials can be used to indicate **where**, **when** or **how** an action is done.

e.g. <u>As quick as a flash</u>, he darted <u>across the busy road</u>. (How he darted) (Where he darted)
